- Positioning strong trusts as a source and as a provider of system leadership capacity.



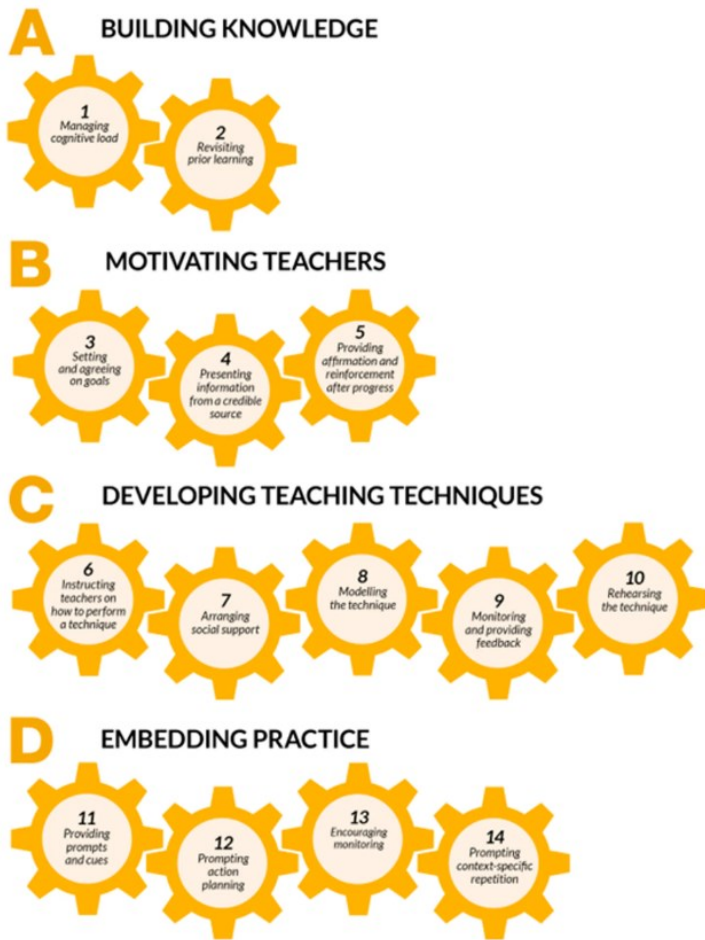
