1. Former Carlinghow pupil earns bronze medal with GB bobsleigh team

Proud mum and Senior Business Support Officer at Carlinghow Academy Debbie Greenwood is celebrating her son Leon's success as a GB bobsleigh athlete. Last month Leon was part of the four-man team that won the bronze medal for Great Britain in the World Cup at Lillehammer.

Born and raised in Batley, Leon's journey began at Carlinghow Princess Royal Primary School. Originally a sprinter, Leon's athletic aspirations suffered a setback following an injury. Despite being told he would never run again, he defied the odds with sheer determination. Today, he is a Team GB competitor, preparing for the next Winter Olympics - now less than 12 months away.

This 2024/25 season, Leon's hard work and resilience have earned him multiple World Cup medals, including a spectacular gold in St. Moritz. His impressive performances also secured the prestigious Bronze Crystal Globe, proving that no obstacle is too great to overcome.

Leon's story is a powerful testament to resilience and the relentless pursuit of dreams. With the Olympics on the horizon, his journey continues.

2. Great Heights Research School secures funding to strengthen school support as its influence grows

- We were delighted to learn that the Research Schools Network has extended the funding for the Great Heights Research School into 2026/27, enabling the team to continue supporting many schools in the region. The letter confirming extension of funding said "Together we've made huge strides in delivering the activity in the regional mobilisation strategy, from the co-constructed regional partnerships through to a suite of Clips from the Classroom videos. Throughout this work, our shared mission to break the link between family income and pupil outcomes has remained a driving force."
- Research School lead Jess Mellor is this month attending a Research Symposium hosted at Eton College, to discuss a flourishing leadership framework being developed in conjunction with the Church of England. Other attendees include Cat Scutt, Deputy CEO at Chartered College of Teaching and Leora Cruddas, Chief Executive of the Confederation of School Trusts.
- Jess Mellor has also been invited to a SHINE drinks reception at the House of Lords in April. The event will bring together winners of the SHINE grant with key philanthropists and influencers, for a conversation about ways of working together to improve outcomes for children from disadvantaged backgrounds. Jess was awarded a £25,000 Let Teachers SHINE award in 2024 for the Fixing Fluency project, which aims to help children read more fluently, so they can understand and enjoy their reading, helping them to achieve greater success at school.
